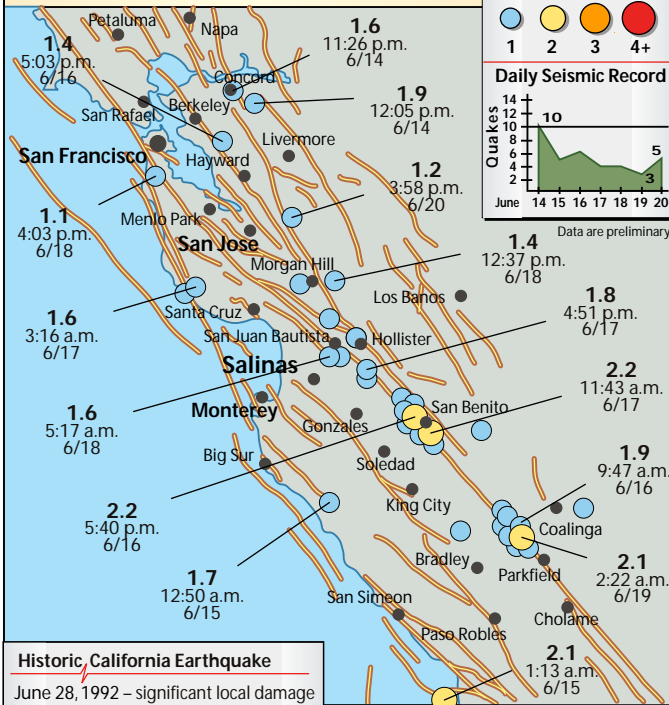

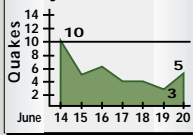

- ▼ Activity in Central California increased slightly from the previous week, rising nine events and back to the 30 quake per week level. The intensity of seismicity remained relaxed, however, producing only four temblors in the M2 range. For the second time in two weeks, no action measured M3.0+.
- ▼ Last week's oscillating seismicity stopped following a burst of ten events on June 14th, as activity remained at the 3-5 eq/day level the remainder of the week.
- ▼ Two clusters of event dominated the activity, one near Parkfield and the other at San Benito. Both contained eight events and action at the M2 level, but none measured larger than M2.2.
- ▼ Activity near San Juan Bautista remained relaxed as did the Santa Clara Valley segment of the Calaveras Fault. A couple of small quakes triggered along the San Gregorio Fault at Point Ana Nuevo.
- ▼ A temblor registering M2.1 triggered a few miles southwest of the Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant. It was the largest quake here in since May 2000. Some may remember a M4.1 jolt in 1980.
